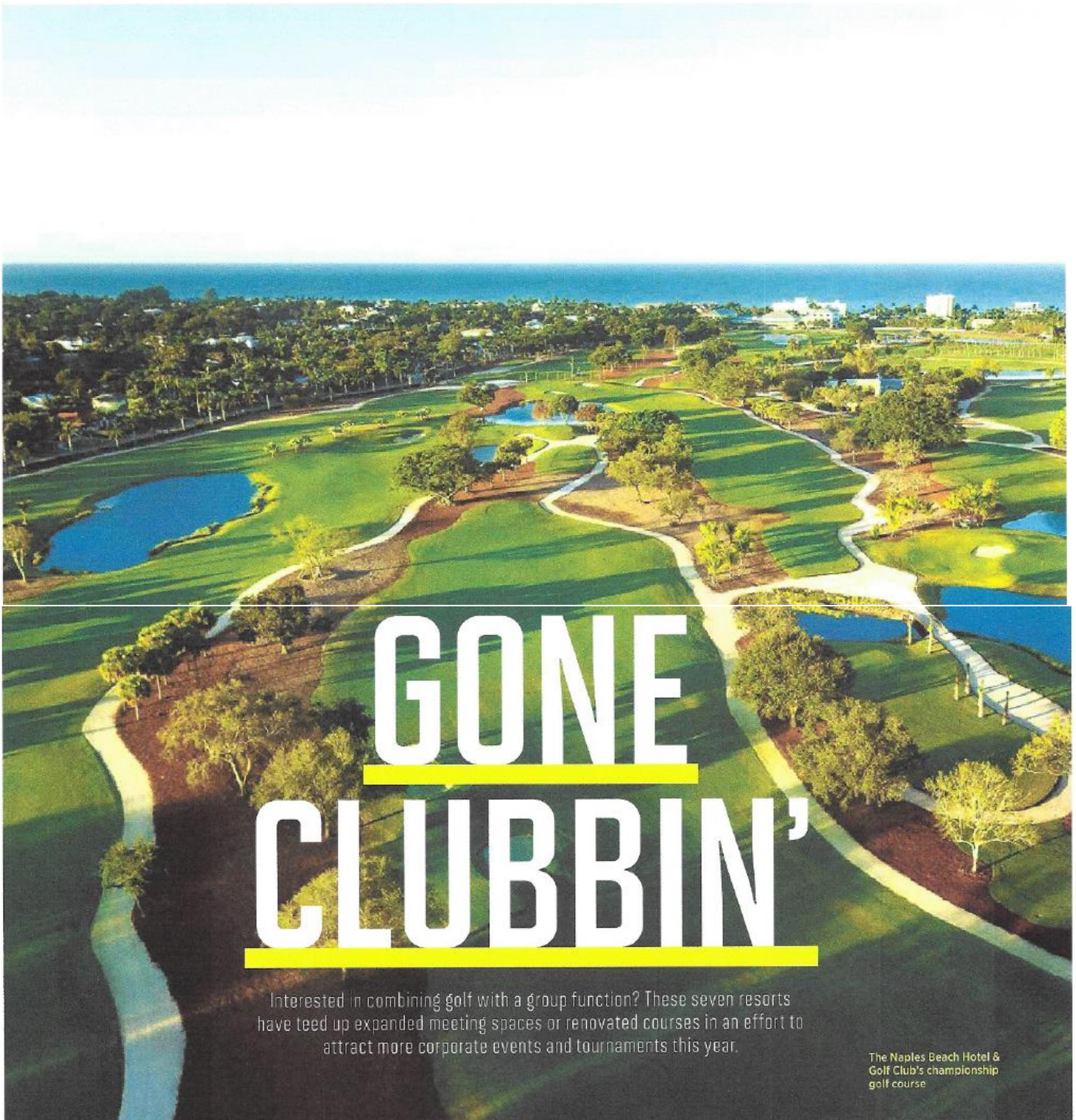


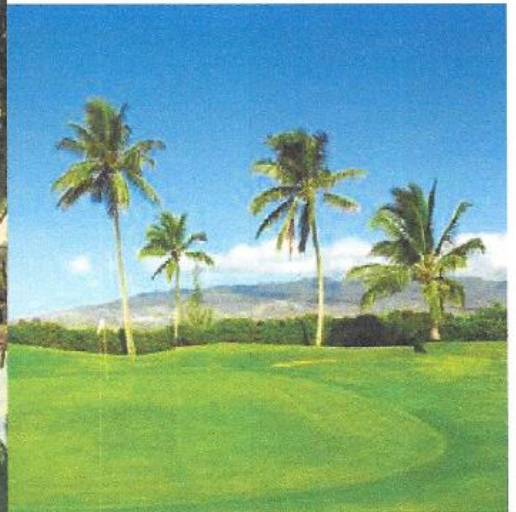
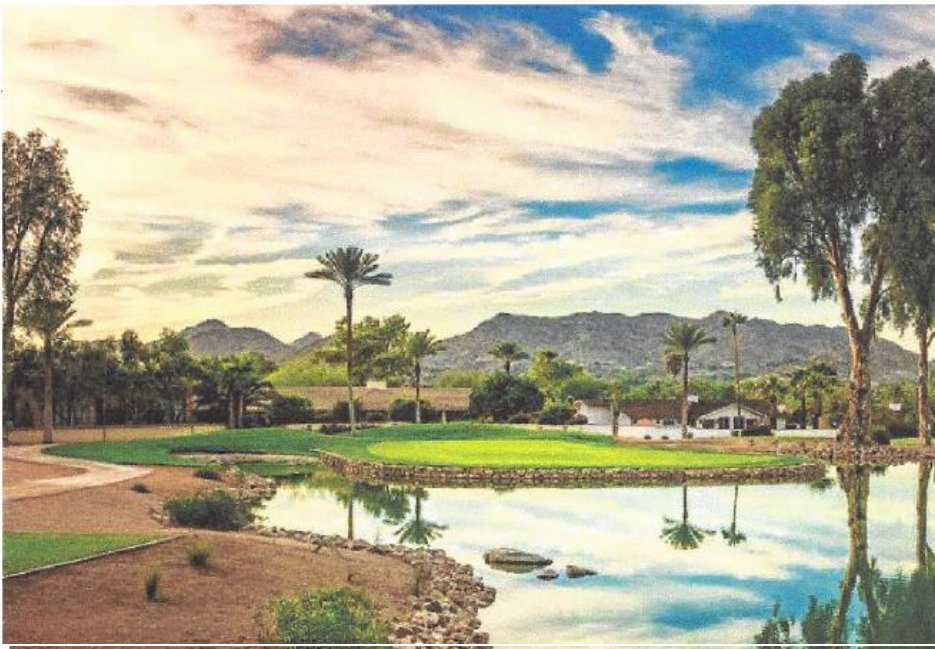

PEBBLE BEACH RESORTS

PEBBLE BEACH, CALIF.

Renowned major championship site Pebble Beach continues to step up its game as a meeting destination in advance of its 100th anniversary. Named for its location near the first tee, Fairway One will become the fifth major meeting facility at Pebble Beach Resorts when it opens in August with a 2,500-sq.-ft. reception space suitable for up to 225 guests.

NAPLES, FLA.

Several South Florida golf resorts have upgraded their facilities in recent months. Leading the way is The Naples Beach Hotel & Golf Club, which completed a \$9 million redesign of its course led by the sport's living legend, Jack Nicklaus. The resort has 34,000 square feet of indoor meeting space, plus multiple beachfront lawns and terraces.

PRINCE WAIKIKI AND GOLF CLUB

HONOLULU

Palm trees, lakes and white-sand bunkers highlight the Arnold Palmer- and Ed Seay-designed 27-hole course at Hawaii Prince Golf Club. In addition to renovating the 7,000-sq.-ft. Pi'inaio Ballroom, the resort has added three group function rooms, named for each of the historic streams that once flowed into the area.

MOUNTAIN SHADOWS

INNSBROOK RESORT

INNSBROOK, MO.

Ongoing renovations at Innsbrook Resort near St. Louis include updates to its ballrooms and boardrooms inside Aspen Center, the resort's lakeside lounge. Innsbrook has eight major meeting spaces with capacities ranging from 12 to 200 people. The highly rated 18-hole course takes advantage of the rolling landscape with forested hills surrounding generous fairways.
